HLTAID006 – Provide Advanced First Aid

Unit Description and Target Group

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to provide an advanced first aid response, including management of the incident and other first aiders, until the arrival of medical or other assistance.

Training Arrangement

This course is delivered and assessed during 2 days of classroom (7 hours per session) of face-to-face training and a 10 hours of self-paced component prior to attending class.

Assessment Arrangement

Students complete a self-paced written test prior to the classroom training, as well as a theory test at the end of the classroom training to confirm their knowledge of theory based content.

Students must also complete practical assessments. Practical assessments are realistic and based on relevant scenarios and simulations.

Practical assessments include realistic, in-depth industry relevant scenarios and simulations. Assessment tools and instruments.



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Additional Support

All students will be provided with a range of learning support options and resources to help them achieve competency. This may include:

- Student Counsellor
- Mentoring from Trainers
- Computer and technology support
- Referral to external support services

Entry Requirement

Students must meet the following requirements:

- All students studying an Australian Course are required by the Australian Government to have (and present) a Unique Student Identifier (USI).
- All students must provide Primary and Secondary identification on the day of training, or alternatively, upload information as a PDF when completing their online enrolment.
- 10 hours of self-paced study completed prior to the classroom session.
- Students must have a reasonable level of literacy and numeracy to complete this course in order to be able to read the training materials and write assessment tasks.
